

Ramps & Home Modifications

Ramps and other home modifications are needed by the elderly and many people with disabilities in order to make their residences accessible. Unfortunately, there is a limited amount of assistance available for such modifications. Listed below are some sources of assistance, which may help individuals with the cost of these modifications.

Statewide Programs

Department for Aging and Independent Living

The Kentucky Department for Aging and Independent Living (DAIL) oversees the administration of statewide programs and services on behalf of Kentucky's elderly and individuals with disabilities. This is done in partnership with Kentucky's 15 Area Agencies on Aging and Independent Living, community mental health centers, Centers for Independent Living, and other community partners. The program that can assist with home modifications and obtaining ramps is the Hart-Supported Living Program https://www.chfs.ky.gov/agencies/dail/Pages/hslp.aspx. This program is for Kentuckians with disabilities to request funds for supports so they can live in their homes and communities and avoid institutionalization. Some examples of allowable home modifications are architectural changes, ramps, and widening doorways. \$2500 limit for rental properties and the modification must be related to the individual's disability.

Kentucky Medicaid Waivers

The Supports for Community Living (SCL) Waiver Program

The SCL waiver program can pay for home modifications that can include ramps and hand rails.(life-time limit of \$8,000).

The Home and Community Based (HCB) Waiver

The HCB Waiver can provide \$2,500 toward the cost of home modifications. The home modification amount of \$2,500 does not go into effect until sometimes in 2016.

Other Medicaid waivers: Acquired Brain Injury (ABI) and Michelle P

The ABI and Michelle P waivers can provide some home modifications.

It is important to note that an individual cannot be made eligible for the waivers just to get these modifications. The individual must receive extensive services that enable them to stay in the home.

Social Security Administration

Social Security has two programs that may increase benefit limits when home modifications are necessary for work: the Impairment-Related Work Expense Program (IRWE) and the Plan for Achieving Self-Support (PASS). The IRWE allows SSI and SSDI recipients to deduct the amount they pay for home modifications from their earned income allowing the individual to receive applicable amount of benefits. However, the individual must prove that these modifications will enable them to go to work. The PASS plan allows SSI recipients who are working for a vocational goal to deduct the amount they pay for home modifications from their earned income allowing the individual to receive applicable amount of benefits. However, the individual must prove that these modifications will enable them to go to work and they have a limited amount of time to achieve an occupational goal. Rural Housing Administration 504 Direct Loan and Grant

Individuals living in a rural community of less than 20,000 individuals can apply for Section 504 loans or grants. The grants may be up to \$7,500 and loans up to \$20,000 at 1% interest. Paying for Senior Care

The PayingforSeniorCare.com website and the Eldercare Financial Resource Locator Tool were created and are maintained by the American Elder Care Research Organization. The organization's mission is to assist individuals in the planning and implementing of long-term senior care. The website is designed to help families and caregivers locate information about long-term care resources for their loved ones, and to find the public and private programs available to assist in covering the cost of such care.

Habitat for Humanity

The Habitat for Humanity under its remodeling program may provide volunteer labor to construct a ramp if materials are provided. Call your local affiliate of Habitat for Humanity for more information.

Veteran's Administration (VA)

The VA offers programs that pay for ramps and home modifications. For more information, contact the VA Office at (800) 827-1000 or KY Department of Veterans Affairs at (502) 595-4447.

Kentucky Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR)

For individuals who qualify for Vocational Rehabilitation Services, ramps and home modifications can be services that are provided if it enables the person to become employed. For more information, contact (800) 372-7172.

Kentucky Assistive Technology Loan Corporation (KATLC)

In a partnership with the Fifth Third Bank Kentucky Inc. KATLC offers a low-rate loan to qualified low-to-moderate income individuals who need home modifications. To participate in this program, applicants must be individuals with disabilities, parents or guardians of individuals with disabilities or nonprofit organizations serving people with disabilities. Home modification loans can be from \$500 to \$15,000. To obtain an application, contact KATLC toll free at (877) 675-0195 or online at katlc.ky.gov.

Fair Housing Act

If you are a renter, the fair housing act requires that your landlord allow you to make your residence accessible. The landlord is not required to assist you in paying financially in doing so. In addition, you must agree to return

the interior of the residence to its original condition when you leave. You do not have to remove exterior modifications such as ramps. For more information on the Fair Housing Act, contact (866) 438-8617.

Realty Associations

Sometimes either your local Home Builders or Realty Associations may devote one day to conduct minor repairs on homes for the elderly. Contact your local association for more information.

Because of the scarcity of funding and resources, many individuals with disabilities turn to churches and other local charity organizations for help with installing ramps or modifying the home. Modifications for Mobility is a critical program for PWC, targeting complicated home modification projects that are typically too expensive for its low-income, disabled clients. Depending on your location and your specific needs, some of the services you could receive include: Handicapped-accessible ramps, Bathroom modifications, Chair / stairlift, Grab bars.

Applicants must be a homeowner and Income that is no more than 50% of area median and live in Campbell, Kenton or Boone Counties. Application information is available on line or by phone.

The Remodeling for Access and Mobility Program (RAMP) makes homes more accessible with the installation of ramps and/or other adaptations for low-income persons with disabilities and/or mobility impairments. Community volunteers and volunteers from the Remodelers Council construct accessible ramps or make other necessary exterior modifications, including installing wheelchair lifts.

You must meet income guidelines and own your own home.
